## Endnotes

- [1] The 109th Congress was incapable of passing a number of FY07 appropriations bills. In order to continue federal funding the newly elected 110th Congress passed a "Continuing Resolution" (CR), which in turn required the National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA) to prepare a "FY 2007 Operating Plan by Appropriation." This tabulation is updated with figures from that Plan, which is available at http://www.energy.gov/media/FY2007OperatingPlanForDOE.pdf . Dashes indicate that the CR is silent on the relevant line item.
- [2] The NNSA Office defines the goal of "Nuclear Deterrent" as "Transform the Nation's nuclear weapons stockpile and supporting infrastructure to be more responsive to the threats of the 21st Century."
- [3] Some budget subcategories under "Total Weapons Activities" are omitted. Indented subcategories are within the budget category immediately above them.
- [4] NNSA plans to ask Congress for a RRW budget adjustment in late FY07, which could add \$\$.
- [5] The Navy has requested \$30 million for RRW in the FY08 Department of Defense budget and says it will request S50 million in FY09 (\$22 million and \$34.5 million will be spent at NNSA sites).
- [6] NNSA explicitly states that it will pay for unproven Reliable Replacement Warheads by cutting back on Life Extension Programs for existing tested nuclear weapons that are known to be reliable.
- [7] Proposed plutonium manufacturing/R&D center for RRW pits. Requested funding is double that of the previously defeated "Modern Pit Facility." NNSA plans to seek construction funding in FY10.
